Impulse Response

In another monitoring area, some of the higher-tech workers were making connections to certain devices for testing. These were special items that allowed a visualization of a group of souls in a matrix that produced an image. The group was connected together and thought of as a congregation. It was important to determine the response of the group as a whole, but each individual element, or "pixel", as the humans called them in referring to their imagers, was also considered.

Life itself provided a continual series of impulses to the device, and the responses of the device followed four major paths: 1) bad: no or low output no matter what the input, 2) noisy: ragged output no matter what the input, 3) non-linear: good output until strongly "pinged", then ragged, limited, or unfaithful response, and 4) good: (mostly) good output no matter what the input.

There was no active attempt by the angels to present stimuli; their job was just to monitor what happened with the inputs that did occur. Not all "pings" were bad; many inputs were Good things, and it was just as informative to see how souls reacted to those.

The Word of the Creator provided regular inputs to those souls who took time to study it. That Word had the power to actually modify the output of a responsive unit, as if the device had a programmable feature that could change how the soul felt and acted when presented with the situations of Life. God looks for a correlation between the response and His Word, and offers to help us with that re-programming.

Reactions from the individuals ranged across the extremes; most had resonant responses to this Truth. When responding to the pricks of Life, some showed a consistent "transmission" that was consistent with that Truth, but others exhibited a negative response. During the time of the Great Teacher, those known as "Pharisees" were in the latter class. In the worst recorded case, some who witnessed the Great Physician heal a man went out immediately and plotted to kill Him¹. The pure pulse that entered souls who lived in defiance of the Good was distorted by their own will.

Various techniques were used to assess the health of each group. A master mathematician developed statistical models – maps and histograms, etc. -- so that changes in the numbers of "pixels" in different response bins (varying across the extremes) for each period could be studied. An angel was assigned to each church² under the auspices of the Shepherd and Overseer of Souls³. Some congregations rang with pure resonant tones, but others had the sound of a cracked bell.

Another group of workers worked on the question of whether the pixels could be "healed"? Some worked to clean up the contamination that affected response, some worked to re-wire or repair connections, some worked to reverse the effects of diffusion, where impurities had crept in. The angels could not do much to help; real change had to come from within the cells. But in their role as watchers and guardians, they worked to strengthen all those who would accept it⁴. And they rejoiced in each and every victory!⁵
