Counting on God's Fingers

Part of an angel's job is to monitor the activities of physical beings, guarding, cataloguing, and keeping track of and ministering¹ to their souls. Teaching us how to accomplish this and other responsibilities is the task of archangels who act as mentors. My name is Barakiel, which means "Blessed by God", and I am known on earth by some as the angel of lightning². But I am still only a student.

In learning about humans, I found it interesting to review the development of their science as they struggled to understand the universe they lived in. It was almost humorous to see the simplicity of counting, for instance, that was built on numbering the fingers of their hands. But from this rudimentary concept, they built up higher mathematical systems to describe the basic dynamics of motion up to extremely large velocities as well as the uncertainty of the activity of very small particles and the correlation between space and time.
