When he walked on water (Matthew 14:22ff)

On the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13ff) Mary in the Garden (John 20:14-15) Christ on the shore (John 21:4)

RQ#3

List the references to the earthly family of Christ.

- Mary and Joseph (Luke 2, etc)
- those listed in the genealogies (Joseph's side -- Matthew 1:1ff; Mary's side -- Luke 3:23ff)
- Mary his mother (Matthew 13:55)
- his brothers James, Joseph, Simon and Judas; also his sisters (Matthew 13:55)
- Elizabeth's family, including John the Baptist (Luke 1:36)

RQ#4

Name the recorded times that Jesus showed that He knew the thoughts of others.

 Satan's power; kingdom divided against itself cannot stand (Matthew 12:25, Luke 11:17) (Matthew 12:25) Jesus knew their thoughts and said to them, "Every kingdom divided against itself will be ruined, and every city or household divided against itself will not stand.

(Luke 11:17) Jesus knew their thoughts and said to them: "Any kingdom divided against itself will be ruined, and a house divided against itself will fall.

- Who can forgive sins but God alone (Mark 2:8, Luke 5:22) (Mark 2:8) Immediately Jesus knew in his spirit that this was what they were thinking in their hearts, and he said to them, "Why are you thinking these things?
- Paying taxes (Mark 12:15); render unto Caesar... (Mark 12:15) Should we pay or shouldn't we?" But Jesus knew their hypocrisy. "Why are you trying to trap me?" he asked. "Bring me a denarius and let me look at it." (Luke 5:22) Jesus knew what they were thinking and asked, "Why are you thinking these things in your hearts?
- Healing on the Sabbath (Luke 6:8) (Luke 6:8) But Jesus knew what they were thinking and said to the man with the shriveled hand, "Get up and stand in front of everyone." So he got up and stood there.
- Who will betray him (John 13:11); not everyone is clean; Judas in particular (John 13:11) For he knew who was going to betray him, and that was why he said not every one was clean.
- Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1ff)
- Plot to kill him (John 7:19)
- Where Jesus is from (John 7:25-29)
- Nathanael under the tree? (John 1:43ff)

(Matthew 27:18) For he knew it was out of envy that they had handed Jesus over to him.

Plural:

(NIV) Jephthah's daughter (Judges 11:37) "Give me two months to roam the hills and weep with my friends, because I will never marry."

(KJV) Abimelech (Genesis 26:26) Then Abimelech went to him from Gerar, and Ahuzzath one of his friends...

Singular:

Judah (Genesis 38:12) After a long time Judah's wife... died. When Judah had recovered from his grief, he went up to Timnah, to the men who were shearing his sheep, and his friend Hirah the Adullamite went with him.

False:

(NIV) Lot (Genesis 19:6-7) Lot went outside to meet them and shut the door behind him and said, "No, my friends. Don't do this wicked thing."

RQ#18

What men made appearances after their deaths, not to die again?

Samuel (1 Sam 28:15)

Moses (Matt 17:3)

Elijah didn't die but was taken in a fiery chariot! Jesus (Luke 24:15, for example) Don't know about those resurrected when Christ was crucified

RQ#19

Name those who said they would not let Israel pass through their territory.

Edom -- Num 20:14 Sihon of the Amorites -- Num 21:23 Og? -- Num 21:33 Also: Balaak wanted to curse them – Num 22

RQ#20

Name those of whom good news was expected.

- 1. Runner Ahimaaz, 2 Sam 18:27, when Absolam was killed
- 2. The Amelekite who brought news of Saul's death; 2 Samuel 4:10; thought he was bringing good news
- 3. Jonathan son of Abiathar the priest, 1 Kings 1:42, Adonijah said, "Come in. A worthy man like you must be bringing good news." (when Solomon was anointed king)
- 4. The Messiah, Isaiah 61:1, the LORD has anointed me to preach good news to the poor

RQ#21

Name those anointed with oil in a very intimate manner.

Saul, 1 Samuel 10:1 (kissed)

Jesus, John 10:1 (Mary wiping with her hair) Possibly: Elders, James 5:14-15 (for the sick)

RQ#22

Name the times when a group anticipating a fight only had two swords or spears.

Simeon and Levi – Genesis 34:25 (avenging the one who took advantage of their sister Dinah) Saul and Jonathon – 1 Samuel 13:22 (the battle of Michmash: where they won a great victory) The disciples – Luke 22:38 (before they went to the garden: Jesus said it was enough)

Moses – to judges (Exodus 18)
