James K. A. Smith wrote that the Creator of the universe enfolds us into his care [even in our struggles] by meeting us in the Son that become flesh." He then used the phrase "Jesus is the Smile of God" to help us visualize the Amazing Grace of God.

We would normally think of Christ as grimacing in anguish (which was very likely the case), but perhaps at times we could imagine Him smiling down at us from the cross; knowing that in His death He was saving our souls and was accomplishing His mission and purpose.

I believe that He smiles at us now as we partake of this communion. He loves it when we come to His table.
