## Human

- 1. Outer box, or place the gift is given
  - we don't keep this
  - sometimes the "place" stays special to us [Transfig notes about location]
  - wrapping, not really a symbol
- 2. Ring Box
  - we would probably keep this, and it would remind us of the ring

Precious substance needed

- 3. The actual ring
  - we wear this every day
  - the traditional wedding language of the symbolism
- 4. Love
  - trying to show love and promise it forever
  - I may not be able to live up to it

The ring doesn't prove love: actions do!

- 1. Church worship [could be anywhere]
  - child is offered (God's Son)
  - marital comparison is also used [church is the bride of Christ]

  - Bread (Body) and Wine (Blood)

Precious substance needed

- 3. Sacrifice
  - Body (pain) and Blood (life)
- 4. Love
  - Reveal the depth of love (Proven!)
  - God has lived up to His promise
