Total Sacrifice

Moses was willing to be blotted out of God's book, Exodus 32:32

Exodus 32:30-32; The next day Moses said to the people, "You have committed a great sin. But now I will go up to the LORD; perhaps I can make atonement for your sin."

So Moses went back to the LORD and said, "Oh, what a great sin these people have committed! They have made themselves gods of gold. But now, please forgive their sin — but if not, then blot me out of the book you have written."

Paul considering giving up his salvation for his people, Romans 9:2-4

I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. For I could wish that I myself were cursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my people, those of my own race, the people of Israel.

[Later he let go of his mission to the Jews in favor of the Gentiles]

Interesting Notes

Sometimes a need was not made known to the prophet:

When the Shunnamite's son died, she went to Elisha without telling anyone the reason.

When she reached the man of God at the mountain, she took hold of his feet.

Gehazi came over to push her away,
but the man of God said,
"Leave her alone!
She is in bitter distress,
but the LORD has hidden it from me
and has not told me why."

2 Kings 4:27

Interesting Notes

[A prophet in the time of Gideon]

When the Israelites cried out to the Lord because of Midian, he sent them a prophet, who said, "This is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says:

I brought you up out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. I rescued you from the hand of the Egyptians. And I delivered you from the hand of all your oppressors; I drove them out before you and gave you their land. I said to you, 'I am the Lord your God; do not worship the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you live.'

But you have not listened to me."

Judges 6:7-10

[the angel of the Lord came to Gideon afterwards]

This is a very early presentation of a prophet; I had not really seen this before.

Interpretation (Prophecy, Scripture, etc.)

[Paul preaches at Rome under guard (1)]

They arranged to meet Paul on a certain day, and came in even larger numbers to the place where he was staying.

He witnessed to them from morning till evening, explaining about the kingdom of God, and from the Law of Moses and from the Prophets he tried to persuade them about Jesus.

Some were convinced by what he said, but others would not believe.

They disagreed among themselves and began to leave after Paul had made this final statement...

Acts 28:23-25a

Interpretation (Prophecy, Scripture, etc.)

[Paul preaches at Rome under guard (2)]

"The Holy Spirit spoke the truth to your ancestors when he said through Isaiah the prophet:

'Go to this people and say,
"You will be ever hearing but never understanding;
you will be ever seeing but never perceiving."

For this people's heart has become calloused; they hardly hear with their ears, and they have closed their eyes.

Otherwise they might see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their hearts and turn, and I would heal them.' [Isaiah 6:9,10 Septuagint]

"Therefore I want you to know that God's salvation has been sent to the Gentiles, and they will listen!"

Parallel Processing

Contrast Between Abraham's Sons

God asked Abraham to sacrifice his "only" son Isaac, but God saved the boy (Gen 22:1-19).

Earlier, God had told Abraham to let Ishmael go (sacrifice?), but then saved him, too (Gen 21:8-21).

Note that Isaac is noted as Abraham's "only" son, Gen 22:2,12,16

This mostly refers to the pre-eminence of Isaac in God's providence; this is a parallel to the idea of Jesus Christ being God's "only" son, even though we are all to be children of God

Interesting Notes

Concerning this salvation, the prophets, who spoke of the grace that was to come to you, searched intently and with the greatest care. ...

It was revealed to them that they were not serving themselves but you, when they spoke of the things that have now been told you by those who have preached the gospel to you by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven.

Even angels long to look into these things.

1 Peter 1:10, 12

The angels never get tired of looking into the gospel.

This means that there is no end to gospel exploration.

There are depths in the gospel that are always there to be discovered and applied not only to our ministry and daily Christian life, but above all to the worship of the God of the gospel with renewed vision and humility.

Parallel Processing

Adam and Christ

Adam and Eve disobeyed and brought us death.

Christ, the last Adam, obeyed and brought us life.

The Old Testament shows sin in all its dimensions.

Christ brings salvation in all its dimensions.

The covenant with Israel was made through Moses at Mount Sinai,

sealed with the sacrificial blood of animals, and called for obedience to the law.

The new covenant was made through Christ, sealed with the blood of his self-sacrifice, and calls for the obedience of faith through the Holy Spirit.

In the Old Testament nobody could go into the presence of God in the holiest place in the temple except the high priest once a year on the Day of Atonement.

Dramatically, at the moment of Christ's death, the curtain in the temple was torn in two from top to bottom, for Christ's own sacrifice has opened the way for us to enter into God's presence.

In the Old Testament God redeemed one nation, Israel, and other nations were not included yet in the people of God.

In Christ, God extends redemption to all nations, and Gentiles are included in God's family.

The Old Testament story takes place primarily in one land, promised and given to one people.

Christ sends his disciples to take the good news to the ends of the earth and to all peoples (as the Old Testament itself promised).

It says that Nebuchadnezzar had gathered together people of every "tribe, tongue and nation."

This was the first time all the nations have been gathered together since the scattering at the Tower of Babel.

In the first year of Darius son of Xerxes (a Mede by descent),

Pointing to Christ

[If we didn't have the gospels, but did have Hebrews]

... we'd be listening for Jesus himself to speak to us through the Scriptures.

Although Isaiah is the one prophesying in Isaiah 8:17-18, the Preacher assumes that he is listening to Jesus talking (Hebrews 2:13).

Similarly, Psalm 40 may be a Davidic psalm, but the Preacher hears the voice of the priestly Jesus coming through loud and clear (Hebrews 10:5-6).
